This Week in School

Last Tuesday our Sacramental Programme children received the Sacrament of Reconciliation which, due to previous bad weather, had to be rescheduled and took place in school. Thank you to all of the parents who were able to support this event (I know the time of it meant that it was impossible for all parents to attend), thank you to Miss Sheridan for organising it and to Father Clarke for giving up his time and a big well done to all of our children – we are very proud of you. Also last Tuesday the Year 5 children took part in the second day of their STEM project involving a series of activities geared around Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. Upon completion of the course, which also involves follow-up work back in school, children will receive a certificate. We also had the second week of our Forest School Club which is run by Mrs Robinson and Miss Sheridan, and the children who attend are extremely enthusiastic about it. Mrs Lovett and Mrs Hinett are also running a very successful Zumba club on Thursday evenings for Key Stage 1 children. Later in the year we will be offering this to our junior children as well.

Links with Cambodia

That same afternoon we will also be holding one of our popular Easter Bingo events in the hall at 2:00 p.m. with a special Easter theme. On Wednesday 28th March, Rhema Theatre are booked in for the whole day to perform a Worship for the children and then work in classes in school on the Easter story. We will then hold the Easter egg raffle draw on Thursday morning and announce the winners of the Egg decorating competition.
