This coming week in School

As mentioned, the Year 2 children have 2 more important tests to complete this week so good luck to you all! Parent/Governor Election

Last Monday saw the final day for nomination forms to be handed in for a vacancy on our Governing Body for a Parent Governor, who are elected by the parents of pupils at St. Mary's to serve a 4 year term of office. Last Friday, each parent should have received a pack containing an explanation of the process, a biography of the two candidates, a voting slip and an envelope to return votes in. The ballot box can be located next to the entrance in school and across from the school office. The closing date for votes is 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday 12th June. Votes will then be counted that afternoon and the result will be announced soon afterwards.

Changes to Data Protection

The national regulations for data protection are changing as of this Friday (25th). The new rules, known as GDPR, express that as a data collector we must state exactly how we use the personal data you share with us. Obviously, it is vital that we have your details in order to communicate with you about your child. Once a child leaves our school the relevant information is passed to the next school and copies are only retained if there is a legal reason to do so. Your data is stored securely and processed Confidentially and we will continue to regularly ask you to ensure we have your most up to date details.

We now require explicit consent from you to hold and store your data so a form will be coming home this week. Please can you complete and return this signed form to school as soon as possible. You will notice that in the future our consent forms will have some extra information on the bottom in regard to how the details you share with us will be used. It goes without saying that all the information we hold is in the interest of effective and safe communication about your child.
