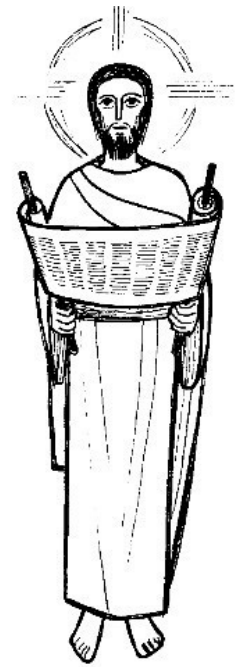

**The Word this Week:** After our brief excursion last week into Saint John's Gospel, we are back on track this week with Saint Luke - whom we will follow for the rest of the year. Today is about beginnings: the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. It begins with the Word of God, in the synagogue. Jesus reads from the Old Testament, as we do every Sunday, and tells the people that it is fulfilled in him. Everything that God has said to his people, through his prophets, comes together in Jesus, the Incarnate Word of God. Today is an ideal Sunday to think about the ministry of reader - about how as readers we make present the same fulfilment, Jesus, when we read the word of God in our Churches.

**Message from Mr Mashiter, Headteacher of St Mary's Primary School, Clayton-le-Moors:** I would like to provide you with a brief update on the progress of our outdoor, eco-friendly classroom. Things are beginning to really take shape and we have lots of exciting plans for the future. We have built the first of our giant planters, made entirely of eco-bricks, and we now have a routine whereby food waste from lunch-time is recycled into these. Our aim is to grow vegetables that we can then donate to local food banks. We have also secured funding to purchase a sail-shade which will cover the outdoor classroom so that lessons can continue at the benches and tables whatever the weather! It is our aim to have an official opening in the Spring term, where we will invite members of the local community to see how the contributions you have made are shaping our children's educational opportunities at St. Mary's. As soon as we have further news of this, I will share it with you straight away! May I thank you on behalf of the school for the amazing contribution you have made and continue to make to this scheme. It is going to really benefit the education and enjoyment that our children have at school with the added bonus of making sure we do our bit for the environment to look after God's world.
