It will give you chance to learn the routines for your children as well as what the year has in store for them. It will also give you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have about your child's new class.

The first meeting of the P.T.F.A. will be on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> September at 3:30 p.m. We would welcome any new members to join us – the more the merrier! Please ask me if you require any further details or simply turn up on the evening – you will be made to feel most welcome. This year alone it has paid for a new home reading scheme in Class 1, a professional artist to spend a day with each class this coming year, our pantomime visit in December and a gigantic historical timeline, bespoke to our school, which will take pride of place in our junior corridor. ## **Warburtons**

## **Bags in school and other reminders**

Just a reminder that the only children in school allowed a rucksack are Year 6 children. This is because as the year progresses, they will be taking home with them folders full of SATS revision and homework that would not be suitable to carry home in plastic bags. If a rucksack goes on a child's hook, it takes up all of the space for the children who have hooks on either side but we have managed to free up just enough space for our Year 6. Please could we ask that instead, all other children have a blue school bag. P.E. kits can stay in school for the half-term unless they really need to be washed. If your child has a club that night, please can they bring kit in a plastic bag. Since we have stopped rucksacks coming into school for every child, there is so much more space in the corridors for everyone to use and school looks so much tidier. Please could children also bring in a drinks bottle. They can fill this up in school from the cold water machines in the infant and junior corridors that we provide. Could we also ask that all kit and uniform has a name label or a sharpie pen is used to write children's names on clothes/pumps etc. Occasionally, clothing does get lost and children forget where they have placed something but if names are inscribed on items of clothing, we will be able to find them straight away unless they have been mixed up and mistakenly taken home by another child, in which case it will be clear for parents to see who the items belong to.


